
News and Updates from the world of Dr. Eugene Rousseau!



Overall Results When Saxophone Sections replaced their current mouthpieces with E. Rousseau:





Gary McCourry continues his playing career on E. Rousseau mouthpieces. Gary performed for 23 years in the West Point Band, (9 years as alto and soprano saxophonist in the Concert Band and West Point Saxophone Quartet, and 14 years as baritone saxophonist in the Jazz Knights Big Band). Since retiring from the Army in 2009, he has maintained an active private teaching and freelance performance schedule in Michigan, where he is the leader of the Beer City Saxophone Ensemble, a 5 to 7 saxophone and rhythm section group based in Grand Rapids. He is a member of the Grand Rapids Jazz Orchestra, the Lansing Symphony Jazz Band, and several other large and small groups that perform throughout West Michigan.

"I have been performing on Rousseau mouthpieces for over 30 years on all saxophones. The intonation and control are unsurpassed. They have outstanding tone, response and flexibility. They also blend well with a saxophone section in classical and jazz settings. I use the 3r and 4r on soprano for both classical and jazz; the NC4 for classical alto, the JDX5 and JDX6 for jazz alto; the 4r, 5r and NC4 for classical tenor; and the JDX 7 and JDX8 for both classical and jazz baritone. Many of my students have also had great success with Rousseau mouthpieces."



Congratulations to the UT Austin Saxophone Ensemble under the director of Dr. Stephen Page for their successful NASA performance. The Graduate Saxophone Quartet was selected as one of 20 Semi-Finalist in the NASA Quartet Competition, from a field of over 100 entrants.
